A Message from Dale Squires

The 2015 horseshoe season was one of the hottest in many years. Rain and hail appeared at the Paddockwood tournament but not until play was finished. The Fall Frolic was cool in the morning; however, the sun appeared in the afternoon where the t-shirts were seen again. T-shirts were the norm this year. Usually the weather is cloudy or windy and the sweatshirts and horseshoe jackets are worn. This year the wind and clouds were kind and t-shirts were worn at almost all the tournaments. I mention the weather because at Battleford the doubles were cancelled due to the heat. At other tournaments the heat was cause for concern. Some people found the t-shirts HSI have for sale a bit heavy and hot to wear. HSI did bring in shirts for comparison and I will discuss this later on in my message.

Last year I mentioned to the Manitou town office the clubhouse needed roof repairs. The bottom needed to have holes plugged to get rid of the foxes and the waterlines had leaks. The Manitou office repaired all of the above. In September Dale and Daniel Squires went to Manitou Beach and removed all the dirt (sand) from the first four pits on each side of the clubhouse. The old sand was placed outside the fence beside the trees. The Manitou office brought us six buckets of sand with a frontend loader to refill the pits and have some extra for reserve. All the posts were measured for height and the depth of the railway tie in the sand. Only a few posts needed to be adjusted and now the digging of the pits will be easier and the shoes shouldn't jump out of the pits like before.

At the end of the 2015 horseshoe season Yorkton's horseshoe club was shut down. With the health of Enid Mroske and Don Low preventing them from carrying on the club could not find anyone to sign up as president and treasurer so they were forced to shut down. Enid's and Don's work in the Yorkton area will be extremely missed by the HSI executive. All current members of the Yorkton club should contact a member of the executive or myself (Dale) regarding membership in 2016. Ken White of Whitewood is the nearest club so calling and joining this club would be really appreciated. When the horseshoe season is closer to starting all the old Yorkton members will be contacted regarding the new season. With Yorkton shut down HSI is down to nine clubs. This should not make any difference at this time in our map grant money, however, lottery sales are down and the map grant money is also down. So clubs

will have to watch on how much is asked for in the upcoming season.

Our website has been an issue for some time. HSI wants to thank Howard Weitzel Jr. for his work on keeping it going. Denise contacted Myron Glova because he had helped other organizations set up their websites. Myron did our pictures and video for the 2012 Canadians. HI gave Myron permission to create a website. A design was in place when the issue of more space being needed for the website came up. Finally all the requirements were met and Myron's computer broke down. Denise was given a time line of November 30th as the website set up day and then all our postings will be up and going in the winter months.

The Western Classic was held in Prince George, BC this year. HSI had members go with everyone having a great time. A list of the players and their accomplishments are listed in the tournament results.

This year the Western Classic is being held at Manitou Beach on July 2nd and 3rd. On Friday July 1st around 6:00 p.m. the home province plays the out-of-province players for a warm up to the Classic. All players go into their percentage group for round robin play on Saturday and Sunday. If you need to find a trailer placement in the park, phone now or as soon as possible to receive a parking spot. Many things have to be talked about for this event. Articles will be needed for the auction table. Further information will be passed on at the Spring Fling tournament. Hopefully lots of HSI members will come out and make this tournament a success.

The Canadian were held in St. Stephen's, NB. Travel was very expensive so only part of the flight was paid. Thankfully the rooms were reasonable and kept the costs down. There was excitement going and even more coming home. Going down everyone got to Toronto when a lightning and thunderstorm struck. I was sitting on a window ledge in the airport when it began to shake really hard. All the workers ran for cover and flights were delayed. After a 1½ hr delay we were off to St. John's landing at the airport around 9:00 p.m. We rented vehicles and found our way to St. Stephen's. On opening the luggage many of the bags were found to be wet. Daryl's bag had only a pair of socks that were dry. We found out that the baggage was not covered in Toronto. After the lightning scare a very hard rain came down soaking everything. Clothes were hanging everywhere in all the rooms except Jack's because he

carried his luggage on board the plane. A dryer was made available by the host at the motel. Daryl had so many wet clothes he went to a laundry mat.

Things went quite well playing wise but I couldn't believe that 15 minutes before playing 10 or more score keepers were still needed. Quite a few of us kept a lot of scores. I made more money keeping score than I did playing. Sites were seen, dinners were had and many more friends were made.

Everyone left around 2:30 a.m. Sunday morning after the banquet getting to the St. John's airport for a 5:15 a.m. leaving time. Around 5:00 a.m. a delay light comes on and then at 5:15 a.m. the flight is cancelled. Air Canada could not find a steward to push the coffee cart up the aisle so they couldn't fly. I had never had this happen before and hope it never happens again. HSI members broke up into three groups because we were told big groups could not be handled. The Galandies, Feeneys and Ken White managed to get a flight pretty much right away. They got to Montreal missing the next flight. This group stayed overnight and got out the next day around 2:00 p.m. finding their luggage at a different hotel just minutes before leaving. Everyone finally got home Monday.

Clara, Bill, Jane, Colin, Jack and Vern were in the second group. Vern and Clara taxied to Fredericton and flew to Toronto later in the day. Clara's flight was ok and she flew to Saskatoon late Sunday night. Vern's flight was cancelled and he stayed overnight in Toronto. Colin stayed in St. John and flew to Toronto Monday AM meeting up with Vern and they flew to Saskatoon together. Vern gave Colin a ride to Dale's house to get his truck to go home. Then Vern made his doctor's appointment. Bill, Jane and Jack flew to Halifax, from there to Toronto and then to Saskatoon. Clara, Bill and Jane stayed in a hotel and headed to P.A. on Monday morning. After helping the P.A. crew, Jack ventured home.

The Squires and Peter taxied to Fredericton after staying in St. John Sunday. Of course the flight was at 5 a.m. so we left by taxi at 2:30 a.m. We travelled to Montreal, then to Winnipeg and finally home on Monday around 4 p.m.

With all this going down Daryl and Wendy stayed with Martin Soucy in St. John and got delivered to the airport on Monday A.M. They met up with Jack Bill and Jane for a chat before going to Halifax to see friends. Daryl and Wendy sent us pictures of them eating lobster while we were stuck in a hotel trying to sleep for a couple of hours. They sure missed some excitement. What a ride, thanks but no thanks. Glad everyone got home safe.

Later on in the newsletter is a list of players and their accomplishments at the 2015 Canadian's. This year the Canadians are in Victoria, BC and no one was asked about going. Dale will contact people after Christmas about going on the trip. Flights will be booked and anyone driving or going on a different flight will be given a certain amount. The ferry prices will be checked for those driving. If you get this newsletter and want to go, contact Dale so you can be entered on the list going to Victoria. Please do not wait until spring to phone because the flights will be booked. Contact Dale if you are interested in Victoria because pending on numbers cost could change. I think this year a four tournament guaranty will be needed to qualify. This will be brought up at the Spring Fling tournament this spring.

Our great treasurer took the big step on October 17th. The man got married to Wendy Koban and brought a new horseshoe player into the Squires family.

Daryl and Wendy were gracious enough to miss the horseshoe season for this prestigious event. Actually this was the day before my birthday and at midnight I was treated to a birthday song. At this point the Saskatchewan salute was given to those that gave the toast. My best birthday present in awhile was seeing Daryl and Wendy getting married. I now have a daughter not just a boat load of boys in the family. Congratulations Daryl and Wendy. May great things happen in your future together. About two weeks after the wedding Daryl had a problem with his knee. Daryl was off work for almost the whole month of November. What a change, no one at our house had to do the feeding and fussing over our son Daryl. Wendy did a great job. Looks like things should be ok in the future. Good luck to both of you.

HSI held a double raffle this year. The two raffles occurred because the articles in the raffle were over \$500 which is the total for our expense on items. Even though the items were donated it is the selling price of the items that is used for pricing. That is why two raffles happened this year. Maybe HSI should have done one raffle in the spring and one over the winter but that is hind sight. Tammy made the tickets and got the lottery license. 1,500 tickets were made for each raffle. Thank you to everyone who bought and sold the raffle tickets this year. This year the tickets will be out early. HSI chose to sell three amounts of money totaling \$500.

Dale brought and sold all horseshoe items at every HSI tournament this year. Items available are t-shirts, golf shirts, hats, jackets, horseshoes, measuring devices and pickup hooks. All these items were sold to members and people interested in playing horseshoe. More horseshoes were purchased to sell while at the Canadians this year. Our sales for this year were just under \$1,000.

At the beginning of the newsletter it was stated that new shirts had been brought to look at during the Fall Frolic tournament. Some members found the old shirts a bit too hot. Two types of shirts were picked as possible replacement, a 100% cotton t-shirt but in a lighter weight, and a golf shirt, 100% polyester and very light. Both the shirts are available in forest green. The prices on these items are higher, approximately \$20 for the t-shirt and \$30 for the golf shirt. The Saskatchewan crest is included but not anybody's name, which is extra. If anyone is interested in the new shirts please contact Dale for ordering. The question being is it going to be hot like last summer which is very unusual for Saskatchewan.

The gathering of cans and bottles by Dale at the tournaments along with donations from friends and members was down a bit this year. The loss of a few key donators caused the decline in the amounts gathered. HSI was still able to collect \$425 for the 2018 Canadians. Thanks to everyone who donated to this project.

Colin is still collecting batteries for HSI. Mr. Vice President has around 200 batteries stacked beside his work shed. Anyone that has a battery or two kicking around please contact Colin or Dale. Batteries can be brought to tournaments for pick up but please give us a call so there is room in the vehicle. Thanks to those who donated to the cause this year.

The concession at most of the HSI tournaments donated some of the profits back to the organization. The five

dollars for a sandwich, desert and coffee has been working just fine. With pop, chocolate bars and other goodies sold separately. Coffee has been given free to anyone needing a drink to start the day or during play. When all the goodies bought during the year were paid back the profit for the lunches and concession was around \$900.

The 50/50 tickets sold during all HSI tournaments have listed the winners in the newsletter. The total at this venture was \$750. Thanks to everyone that purchased tickets in this successful enterprise.
