A Message from Dale Squires

The 2015horseshoe season was quite interesting and busy throughout the year. The start of the season was a week earlier than usual due to the leap year. Starting the season earlier worked out well because of the early snow melt.

At the start of the year Dean and Dale Squires took out the old pits in the Market Mall area and replaced them with new pits and back boards. This task was completed by the first week in April. All the tournaments went on with no complications until the provincials when it rained early and we held the meeting at the office in Manitou. After the meeting the singles were played and the mixed doubles later in the day.

Early in May the Manitou Beach site got a lot of work done to it. The leaves were picked up the back boards were replaced and a lot of the pins were adjusted or replaced with new pins. Peter, Colin and the Squires clan worked on site over a four week period to get ready for the Westerns.

Everything was ready for Canadians with only the PA tournament to play when things got interesting. Dale was packing to go to PA when he had numbness in his right side and collapsed at home minutes before hitting the highway. The ambulance was called and the hospital experience was complete on Wednesday. During this time Clara handled the tournament with a lot of running about. Thanks to those players there, everything went with no problems.

Everyone headed to Victoria on Tuesday with Denise and Dale going out on Friday. Without knowing, Dale was admitted to the Canadian Hall of Fame as a builder/organizer. A complete shock to say the least. Everyone came back and finished the year at Manitou Beach.

In September, the Exhibition said we could build in the pits instead of building them every year. So everything was measured and ready to go. Then the early snow hit and for a few weeks nothing was done. The weather warmed up and 5 full courts were built and blocks put in for throwing with pins and sand put in before it got cold.

It looks like the stroke did not slow me down too much and we should be back throwing in the spring. The question will be 40' or 30', depends on my arm strength. Right now 40' is a struggle so we will see in the spring.

Dean Galandie put two courts inside his work shop so look out for the Regina crew in the spring.

Dale with his sales of HSI hardware; shirts, hats, horseshoes, hooks and measuring devices had a very reasonable year. Quite a few shoes were sold this year and more were purchased for sale this upcoming year, along with other items. HSI collected over \$800 in sold goods.

This winter I am looking at purchasing golf shirts, t-shirts and hats for the Canadians in 2018. I was thinking maybe people could buy them ahead of time and advertise the product for the following year. I could put a special order in wit shirts going in different colors and the hats having the crest of Whitewood, SK on the front instead of the back which was done in Saskatoon. This will give us extra sales before the given day of play and everyone can get the size and color they want. I am in the process of getting prices for shirts and hats with the change of the logo on the hat. Hoping everything goes well it will be talked about at the Spring Fling or if anyone is interested give me a call.

Thanks for buying horseshoe product from HSI. All products will be with Dale at all tournaments in the 2017 season. If anyone needs a new shirt or a lucky pair of horseshoes give us a call.

HSI collected bottles and cans at all the tournaments this year. Members and friends donated over the year and we were able to collect over \$600 which was placed in the Trust Fund. This money will go to travel assistance at the 2018 Canadians. Colin returned batteries to go to HSI again this year with a total of over \$1,500 making its way to the Canadians. Thanks to everyone who donated cans and batteries. It will go a long way to hosting the Canadians. If anyone has bottles or batteries call Dale or any executive member to pick up or receive the articles collected. Bring them to the tournaments if possible and if there is a good amount let us know ahead of time so room can be organized for the return.

Most of the concession outlets at the HSI tournaments donated some money towards the Canadians. For \$5 you make a sandwich, desert and coffee. All players and friends are available to buy lunch as long as HSI has an estimate of how many people are coming plus guests. We need to have people phone the contact person for the tournament on Thursday or Friday before the contest. This way the appropriate amount of food and drinks can be purchased. It also makes it easier to do an estimate on the draw by entering names in the computer and placing everyone in their proper group. This year HSI did make around \$900 in the food and drink area. Denise is hoping when the tournament is in your town that members and friends could help in bringing desert or other things. It is a lot of work for one person and

hopefully she can get some help from more of our members. Thanks to everyone who bought lunch during the year.

The skins games were played on Sunday afternoon with 16 players participating. In this tournament people have to pre-register to play and with groups of 8 in each division. This means the first 16 entries are in and HSI would need 8 more players to qualify for a third group. This year HSI had only one extra person apply and had to say to this person that not enough players were found so the entry was declined. This only shows that more people need to get involved and entries need to be in sooner than later. This year the provincials will be held the weekend before Canadians so maybe more entries will follow.

Manitou Beach tournament was rained out and held later with the Swift Current tournament with only one draw for the 50/50. The Prince Albert tournament did not hold a draw when Dale and a van full of people did not make the tournament due to health reasons. HSI still

pulled in over \$700 with the help of the players and friends in attendance during tournament play. Thanks to everyone who bought tickets over the year.

The 2016 hockey draft was handed out to the different clubs and members at the Fall Frolic. All clubs were asked to sell a minimum of 10 drafts. There are 21 different groups with 5 players in each category. The players are picked on the prior year's scoring and saves by players and goalies. Some clubs did a bit of extra sales for a total of 181 entries. Around the end of April the regular season came to a close with the winners holding off about six other teams on the last day.

50% of the total goes to the payout, 1st place is 30%, 2nd place is 15% ad 3rd place gets 5% with the rest going to HSI to go towards the Canadians in 2018. This year HSI was able to receive 182 entries which will be almost the same payout as last year. Thanks to everyone who sold and bought tickets this year.

The Western Classic was held at Manitou Beach on July 2nd and 3rd. There were over 62 entries from BC, Alberta and Saskatchewan. The hosting grant was denied because the BC group of 3 or 4 was not equal to the Saskatchewan number of 26 and Alberta's number of 32. All the clubs donated money to make the Western Classic work. With the success of the auction, the banquet and 50/50 tickets combined to pay off the expenses accrued during the event. The weather was great during the tournament. Everyone had a great time with some winners and losers but friendship and good times were abundant. This year's Western Classic will be held in Calgary on the July 1st weekend. During the Western Classic meeting it was voted that next year players will be placed in order of the percentage each person has. An example of this would have Colin Finnie at 40', playing Jane Cordingly in ladies and Lyle Omstead in Elders. Before, each player would get 1st place in their group. Now the payout would be 1st, 2nd and 3rd depending how everyone finished. The top six averages will be in group A, followed by the next six in group B. So this means ladies, elders and 40' will play against each other. The old groups, Mens A, B, C, D, Ladies A, B, C, D and Elders A, B, C, D etc. will no longer exist. Now the group payouts will be different unless the tournament organizer plays out the difference to the lower players in the group. Calgary wanted to hold the Western Classic there all the time, however, on the Saskatchewan side of thing our executive thinks only

a few people would go and if money was needed to payout Saskatchewan could not donate in this case. By holding it in Saskatchewan every third year it would give our members a chance to play in a more high end tournament against players from other provinces.

The Canadians was held in Victoria, BC. HSI had 15 seats available with the addition of six more players out of Regina late in the time frame. Just before starting to play Dale had a stroke which caused him and his wife to drop out of the trip. Our team consisted of 18 players and one national representative. The meeting was held with Daryl taking Dale's place along with Tammy. Our members had a very successful finish. Colin Finnie got 1st place with an extra playoff game and also being down 16 – 0 to start against Andre Leclerc. Jim Feeney and Stewart Lawrence both won in their divisions. Dianne Galandie received 2nd, Dean Squires was 3rd with the PeeWees Brayden and Garrett Christensen placing 2nd and 3rd in their group. All other players had quite good finishes with the odd whoops. Everyone had a great time, saw some sites and met more players to call friends from their experiences at the Canadians.

To make things interesting, Dale got out of hospital on Wednesday and rested Thursday at home. On Friday Dale and Denise flew to Victoria to watch the Saskatchewan players play and saw some very good games. In the ceremonies a few people received awards for volunteering. The Squires clan, Daryl, Wendy and Denise, were recognized for helping Diane Beck enter the games on the computer. Daniel played his 15 games and also paced 23 other games. This shows how Saskatchewan players and members will help with the play at Canadians and congratulations on your recognition by the Canadian executive.

After all the ceremonies were over and everyone received their rewards, Mike Holley introduced a speech for the Hall of Fame about the builder/organizer category. Mike mentions that it's not always your top players but people behind the scenes making valuable contributions to keep horseshoes going in their area, also for Horseshoe Canada. He mentions curling, building pits along with the receiving of the Ellison award. There was a bit more talk but when they said my name (Dale Squires) the chair almost went for a tumble. My head was bussing while Mike was talking and I never thought it was me getting the award. It took me a bit of time to get over the situation before going up to get the award. Thanks to Jack E. Adams and the HSI for renewing our

flights to get there for this special occasion. I still can't believe it but it sure bodes well for Saskatchewan members with Colin being entered in 2012 and me in 2016. Thanks to everyone and I plan to be in Guelph in 2017 with another great group of people.

The raffle draw was completed and drawn for at the Fall Frolic in August. HSI made the tickets and distributed them to all the clubs with a minimum of 12 books per club. Denise brewed up 200 books of tickets with 10 tickets in each book. A book of tickets sold for \$10 or one ticket for a loonie. The tickets sold were for \$250 for 1st, \$150 for 2nd and \$100 for 3rd. With all 2,000 tickets sold, minus the \$500 payout HSI was able to receive \$1,500 to go towards the Canadians in 2018. Thanks to everyone who bought and sold the raffle tickets for HSI. It was a complete success and I believe this draw will be done the same next year.

Tammy, Daryl and Dale met with people from the Sports Trust Fund near the end of October. This meeting was to grade horseshoes over the past three years. In different categories we showed them HSI is in pretty good shape. They were quite happy in all the categories along with our new website. Tammy has not heard from them if we need to upgrade anything. This summer our new website was put online and Denise can put everything up as soon as it is completed. With any luck and our work passes the test, HSI should be good for another three years.

Horseshoe season is completed for another year with great success. A few new members were added and a lot of great times were had by all.

Thank you to everyone for a great year and have a fantastic winter. Hope to see everybody at the Spring Fling when another horseshoe season starts.




