A Message from Dale Squires

This past season was a success in regards to the weather. There were no rainouts this year but rain was close by in a few tournaments. The player turnout for tournaments this year was down a bit with the exception of a couple tournaments that had great turnouts.

Sales of horseshoe items were down this year other than a few people needing shirts for the Canadians. the sale of horseshoes was quite good. Key Lake mine bought 12 pairs of horseshoes to go with the 7 or 8 pairs that were sold to individuals around the province. HSI was able to get another 100 measuring devices made thanks to Marg Kemp's contacts. All the previous devices that were in stock sold out. Also, the business making them had started to shutdown. Colin and myself were able to pick up two huge batteries from the same work place for our collection. These batteries were over a thousand pounds each and HSI received a great return from the sale of the batteries. Colin also collected a large amount of batteries over the year with the proceeds going to the Canadians. Our bottle collecting was down a bit, however, due to a core group of people, HSI was able to collect a few hundred dollars. Thank you very much everyone for your generosity.

The concession money donated by some of the clubs was another success, with a decent amount of money being collected in this fundraising effort. Clubs participating in this venture can claim the donation on the map grant. The 50/50 tickets sold during all the sanction tournaments were well received by all the players and over five hundred dollars made its way to the junior account.

Howard Weitzel, Sr., congratulations from all the members of Horseshoe Saskatchewan Inc. on your induction to the North Battleford wall of fame. Everyone knows the dedication and skill you have towards the game of horseshoe, with numerous rewards coming at Provincials, Canadians and at the World tournament levels. You have been #1 for decades at the Provincial level in the 40 ft class and later at the 30 ft class. Howard, you are very deserving of North Battleford's acknowledgement of your horseshoe endeavors. Way to go Howard.

The Canadians were well represented by the western provinces. Players from the east provided only 11 of 12 participants. Saskatchewan had over 30 players with different percentages and age groups. Our members did the province proud with excellent results. Colin and myself finished one-two in the men's A 40 ft class. Clara finished 2nd in the ladies. In a couple of elders classes HSI members finished 1, 2, 3. In the junior boys class Daniel finished 2nd and Dale was 4th. Peewees saw Brayden come in 2nd losing his last game going for the championship. Garrett placed 3rd. A full list of players is shown below and where they placed in their class.

The main tournament of the year was the Canadians held in Saskatoon. I was the chairperson for this event and asked all the clubs around the province to see if they could get donations to give away at the auction table and the banquet. It was an unbelievable success with lots of items everyday for the auction table and almost enough giveaways for everyone at the banquet.

The setup for the Canadians was well attended by people from all over the province. My garage was full to the brim with everything from pits, scoreboards, brooms, chairs and a few hundred sheets of plywood. All these items were brought over to the Nutana curling rink in half tons by members of HSI. The plywood was delivered Friday and was found to be a little warped. So after buying 3 stores out of 1/2" screws and a couple hundred H clips and all the small and medium metal braces we leveled the plywood. The pits were brought in and spaced 6 ft apart. After the pits were in place, the sand was delivered and with Peter Dudek talking with the construction site next door we were able to use their bobcat. Peter drove the bobcat and placed the sand in the middle of the courts and many members used wheelbarrows to place the sand in the pits. Once all the pits were in place plus four courts outside for practice, foul lines were measured and over 15 rolls of duct tape were used to mark the 30 ft and 40 ft foul lines. All the tape was stapled down and very little tape had to be replaced during play. Next item to be installed was the fence and tarps to stop the shoes from bouncing all over the place. We also fenced the practice courts outside to prevent shoes from hitting vehicles. Then the scoreboards, chairs and water barrels were placed along with two sets of bleachers from Manitou Beach. The sand stayed moist for the day and the pits only needed to be watered in the evening after the days games were finished. The only regret felt was the heat. It was pretty warm while playing. On second guessing, maybe we should have held the opening ceremonies outside. When the big door opened the heat got inside the building increasing the temperature for playing later. But even with the heat the games were played and the success of the event was shown in the results. Media coverage was unbelievable. A phone call to CTV and CBC got both TV channels out. Every time Colin was seen a camera and microphone were always in the vicinity. I even found myself on TV. Good thing I didn't have time to think about things. The TV people would say do this or that and one time we did one scene four times. Back in the day I would have froze but now it is no big deal. The newspaper did an article on Howard Weitzel. Colin and myself were in the Saskatoon Express. HSI even put ads on the radio and one of our past plays, Bob Rio, heard about the Canadians on the radio and made an appearance to watch. Maybe we will see him in the future. HSI received emails from Ontario and New Brunswick where they saw us on TV and said it was the best coverage for the Canadians in years. HSI made its own video and pictures were taken of players during the tournament and at the banquet. This video was placed on our website and viewed by many. The concession was handled by Willy and his crew whom I had recruited while curling the previous winter. We had members and friends work in the kitchen during the week. I must say thank you to Loretta Richmond who made a boat load of pies with the help from her family members. Loretta worked in the kitchen everyday and because of all the help we put into the kitchen HSI received all the proceeds from the pies as well as a percentage of the sales during the Canadians. Clara and Jane set out the auction table each day and other members took turns sitting at the table selling our horseshoe items (shirts, hats, etc) and banquet tickets. It was handled very well with excellent results.

The 50/50 tickets were sold by the Whitewood club and other members during the week and the sales went over quite nicely. Bartender extraordinaire, Colin, did a few nights of work with Ray Kimpton who worked the day shift along with many other duties instead of playing in the tournament. Colin's night shift as a bartender didn't stop him from winning his 9th Canadian title. Other members helped sell liquor tickets and work in the bar. This part of the event brought in some money for HSI. Frank and Marlene Ironstand brought in a karaoke machine on Friday. I would like to thank them very much. On the other nights players brought in their guitars and had jam sessions. Denise and Tammy did a lot of running around all week picking up all necessary items needed for all the different functions going on. They also did the final cleaning at night of the rink floors, chairs and the bathrooms. A thankless job and much appreciated for their working this area. On the last day the final draw was played at 10:00 a.m. instead of noon so the banquet could be setup without a rush. After the draw was completed some players came and asked if they could help dismantle the playing area. Between 20 and 30 players went out and removed the tarps and fence along with unscrewing all the plywood and pits. Everything was piled in different areas and made it a slam dunk to finish on Sunday. Many thanks to all the people assisting in the takedown. There were many players from other provinces...to them, a special "Bless You". Sunday we only had to remove the sand and clean the whole building which was completed. Monday the plywood was picked up and sold along with the fencing. The sand didn't get picked up until the next weekend and delivered to the Willows Golf Club, who paid us for the sand to repair different areas on the golf course. With the sale of the plywood and sand the whole setup cost us around \$100. Overall, it cost a bit to host the Canadians with the rent of the building and construction of the pits. However, with all the donations, kitchen, bar, auction and banquet all held in one place.

The whole event cost us about \$10,000 which was easily covered by our battery collecting and our members donations into the Sask Lottery Trust Fund along with the hosting grant from Sask Lotteries. The pits were placed in a friend's garage close to the rink and later moved to Colin's farm, with a few courts staying in town for our Saskatoon tournament. With a lot of work the Canadians was a hell of a success. Thanks to all members and friends for their help on this fantastic journey.

Next year the Canadians will be held in Belleview, ON on July 10th to 14th, 2013. Flights land in Toronto with a 2 hour drive to Belleview. A few phone calls will need to be done to see how we can get to Belleview from the airport. I will find out and contact people in the spring. A new journey is about to begin.

The Western Classic is being hosted in North Battleford June 29th and 30th at the request of that club. Denise will still be the draw master. The change of venue will get the pins and courts upgraded at their club. To book campsites, do so early because play is on the July 1st long weekend. Check the website for accommodations and costs for hotels and campsites. Thanks to the North Battleford club for asking to do this tournament and I hope the occasion has a good turnout and everyone has fun.

I hope everyone winters well and we'll see you in the spring.

Colin joined the Saskatoon Horseshoe Club. Colin works as a pest control agent in 4 municipalities in Sask. He also works in a farm machine shop setting up different machines around the province. Then he has the home farm to look after with all the animals and the haying to do. Throw in helping the neighbour put in his crop and take it off and you have one busy person with a very big heart.

Colin always seems to find time when the phone rings and it is time for another road trip to a horseshoe tournament somewhere in the province. Colin has always been an excellent player, sportsman and ambassador for the sport. He travels to most tournaments in Saskatchewan as well as the Canadian's, Western Classic and certain tournaments in Alberta along with appearances in different World horseshoe tournaments. His demeanor never changes. Whether he wins or loses, he is always the "gentleman player". He does not get mad at himself or others regardless of the circumstances. Colin enjoys the sport, but at the same time he strides to pitch the best he can in each and every game he plays. When a "fun "doubles draw is played, Colin is usually paired with a player with significantly lower percentage. Instead of complaining, he encourages his partner and revels in the ringers that he\she gets. He is the first one to help out at any tournament. Where there

is a need for scorekeepers, judges, court preparation, etc, you can always count on Colin. If help is needed, he is there. Whether it is first thing in the morning or late at night after the play has completed, you can find him not basking in his win, but putting chairs away and turning the pits.

Colin also supports Horseshoes in an administrative function as he is the Vice President of Horseshoe Saskatchewan. As well, Colin is a certified level 2 coach. Here are a few of his accomplishments.

At the Canadian's, he has been the champion 9 times; 1994 64%, 2002 73%, 2003 71%, 2004 68%, 2005 66%, 2007 68%, 2008 70%, 2011 67%, including this year's win 2012.

At the Saskatchewan Championships, he has won the tournament 12 times; 1991, 2000, 2002 to 2011 inclusive. He also won in 2012. His first Saskatchewan junior championship was in 1980.

Colin has also performed well at the Western Classic where he has won 8 times; 1992, 1994, 2002, 2003 and 2005 to 2009.

Colin went to quite a few World tournaments and his best finish was a 5th place finish in the men's championship class in Red Deer Alberta. He also beat Allan Francis in the championship class in Bismark, ND.

This list of Colin's accomplishments shows that he belongs with the elite players in this wonderful game of horseshoes.
